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### 2. Program Name: CA Virtual Assurance

### 3. Specified Operating Environment

The CA Software's specifications and specified operating environment information may be found in the Documentation accompanying the CA Software, if available (e.g., a user manual, user guide, or readme.txt or notice.txt file). “Documentation” means (a) with respect to CA Software: only standard specifications, user documentation, and technical manuals and guides provided with the CA Software (some or all of which may be in English only) and (b) with respect to Maintenance and warranty support: CA’s external policies covering the scope and nature of Maintenance and warranty support available to CA customers can be found at <http://www.support.ca.com>.

### 4. Licensing Model

The CA Software is licensed by the number of Physical Sockets. A “Physical Socket” means an electrical component attached to a printed circuit board (“PCB”) and electrically interconnects a central processing unit (“CPU”) and PCB. A CPU is the specialized integrated circuit that executes binary programs and performs most logical functions or calculations. One physical CPU may have up to twelve (12) processing cores.

If Customer is receiving the CA Software in the form of a bundled appliance then “Appliance” means a single CA-provided physical server platform that is bundled with and operates the CA Software that is pre-installed on this platform. Customer will own the Appliance upon CA’s receipt of the applicable fees, free of any liens or encumbrances, subject to the terms and conditions of the license agreement. The Appliance is provided by CA to Customer in the form of a bundled appliance, so that the Appliance is designed for use solely to access and operate the pre-installed CA Software.
